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## SHOLING FC 6-A-SIDE TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Eligibility is according to age at midnight on 31 August 2018 (this year's age groups).
2. All matches will be 6-a-side with squads of no more than 10 players except U7 and U8 which will be 5-a-side with squads of no more than 10 players.
3. Substitutions may take place at any time during the game deemed suitable by the referee. 'Rolling' substitutions are allowed.
4. No player may represent more than one team.
5. There will be no offside.
6. All players must wear suitable attire including shin pads.
7. The first named team for each fixture shall provide the match ball (size 3 for U7 and U8, size 4 for U9 – U14). They also have choice of ends and kick off.
8. In the event of a colour clash the second named team will be asked to change.
9. At U7 – U10 the retreat line will be in play as with Mini Soccer Rules.
10. At U11 – U14 no goalkeeper to kick directly from hands (e.g. drop kick). Goalkeeper must either roll the ball out or place ball on the pitch and pass out.
11. Players must be at least three metres away from the ball for free kicks, corner kicks and goal kicks.
12. If the ball goes out of play along a touchline then play is restarted with a throw in. A defending player may stand no closer than 2 metres from where the throw in is taken.
13. All other football laws apply (including the back pass law for U10 and above)
14. Generally matches will be 15 minutes one way.
15. Teams will score 3 points for a win and 1 point for a draw in the group stages.
16. In the event of teams being tied on points in the group stages, league positions will be resolved by (i) result between the teams (ii) goals scored (iii) least goals against (iv) goal difference (v) flip of a coin.
17. Draws in the knock-out stages will be resolved by the best of 3 penalties (followed by sudden death). Only players on the field of play at the time of the final whistle may participate in penalty shoot-outs.
18. Reporting results – the referee will hand the result slip to the first named manager for it to be taken to the results table.
19. In the event of a carded player:





- (a) Yellow carded player: will be subjected to a 2 minute 'sin bin' cooling off period within the remaining time within the match (the team will play with a player less for this period). A second yellow in one match constitutes a red card and that player will remain unavailable for the rest of the tournament;
  - (b) Red carded players will be removed from the field of play immediately and will take no further part in the competition.
20. Winners and Runners-up will receive a trophy/medal per player. The winning Team will also receive a Team Trophy.
  21. If a team is not present for the scheduled kick-off of one of their games, or should have insufficient players to start the match, then they will forfeit the points and the game awarded to their opponents along with the 3 points.
  22. Any appeal against a decision of the Tournament Committee must be made in writing to Hampshire FA in accordance with its Rules within fourteen (14) days of the posting of the decision of the Committee and accompanied by an appeal fee of £50.00.

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## THE HAMPSHIRE FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION GENERIC SAFEGUARDING BRIEFING FOR CHILDREN ATTENDING ORGANISED SANCTIONED FOOTBALL TOURNAMENTS WITHIN HAMPSHIRE CFA

Hello players/teams,

We are delighted you have chosen to be part of our Football Tournament which is sanctioned by Hampshire FA. Every one of you are most welcome, we want you to enjoy your football experience today, the aim being that you can participate in a safe and fun environment and be protected from abuse and harm. This is the responsibility of every adult involved in football here today, thus every adult is required to endorse and adhere to our Club's Safeguarding Children Policy which is in line with the Hampshire FA and FA Policies.

This Tournament organised by Sholing FC (Iain Calder, Tournament Coordinator) recognises its responsibility to safeguard the welfare of children and young people who play or participate in football by protecting them from abuse and harm. As someone who has not yet reached your 18<sup>th</sup> birthday you are classified as a child/young person. To make you aware Abuse & Harm can be as follows:

**Abuse:** a violation of your human or civil rights by any other person or persons and, shall include physical abuse, emotional abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and bullying.

**Harm:** ill treatment and forms of ill treatment (including sexual abuse and forms of ill-treatment which are not physical). Our Safeguarding Children Policy is supported by The Hampshire Football Association's Respect programme to address verbal abuse and bullying of children and young people by parents and coaches on the sidelines. All suspicions and allegations of abuse will be taken seriously and responded to swiftly and appropriately. If you are unhappy about an incident today please report your concern to either your parents, Coach/Manager or indeed to our Control Tent and a member of the Tournament Committee who are as follows:

I would also like to make you aware that Clubs must have in place a qualified Welfare Officer in line with The Hampshire Football Association affiliation requirements. A Club Welfare Officer must sit on the Management Committee of your Club and are the designated person at your Club responsible with and alongside other Management Committee Members to ensure you are safe and happy at your Club.

The role of the Club Welfare Officers is to be clear about the Club's responsibilities when running activities for children and young people and ensure those actively involved with children and young



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people understand what their duty of care means on a day to day basis. If you do not know who your Club Welfare Officer is, please ask your parents or your Coach/Manager so if in the future you need to talk to your Club Welfare Officer then you know how to contact them.
